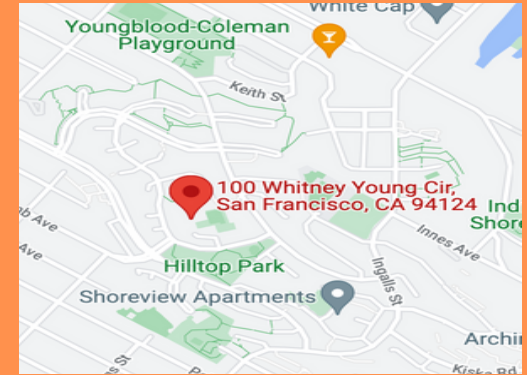

Early Childhood Development



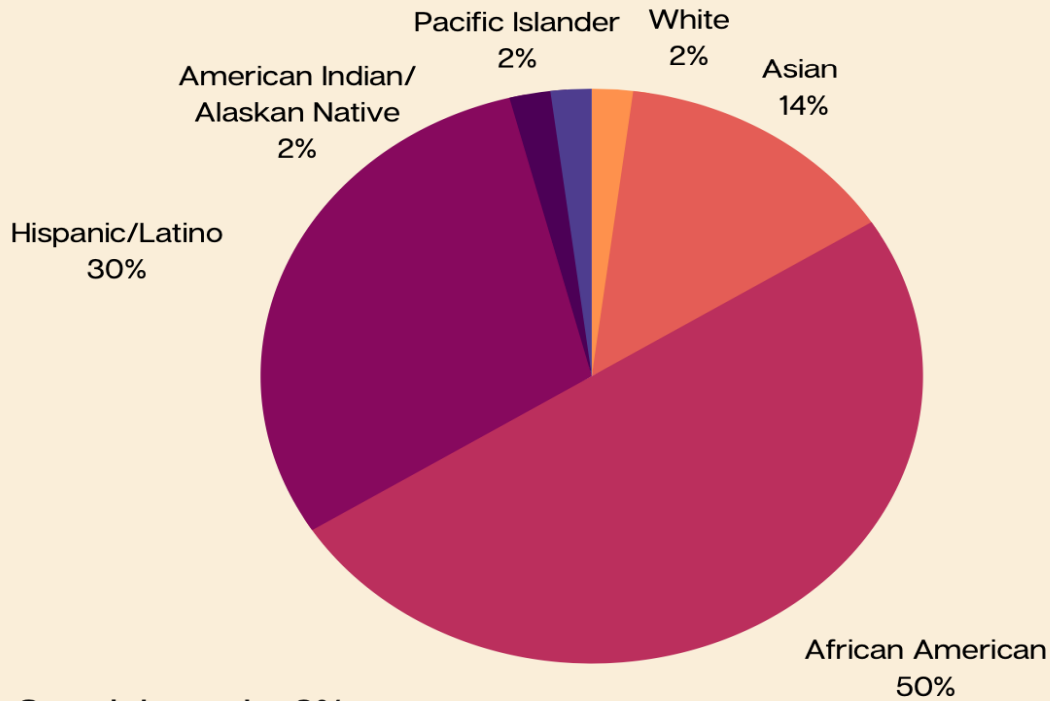
We provide early childhood services (247 days a year, 10 hours per day) to 300 young children at three centers and over 37 family childcare homes throughout San Francisco, with a focus on Bayview and SE San Francisco.

There is an increasing need for infant-toddler services, mental health services, and early childhood/health connections in San Francisco, and FACES SF is interested in providing more of these services.

Families paying full fee: 1%



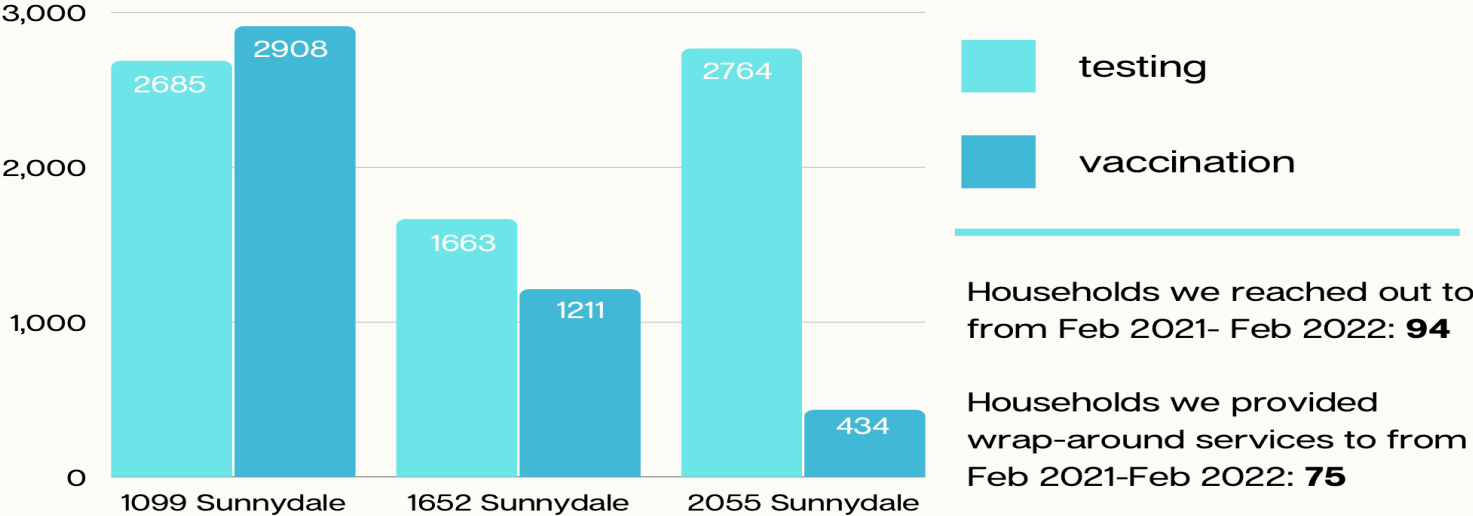
School-Age Programming

In addition to early childhood services, at our Bayview campus we provide before- and after-school programming that focuses on academic tutoring, social-emotional support, and hands-on enrichment. We serve about 80 students each year with funding from DCYF and state childcare grants.



During the pandemic, we have worked with partners throughout District 10 to provide testing and vaccination, as well as food deliveries to families throughout SE SF.
