### **New Crosswalk Program**

Goal: Proactively install high-visibility

continental crosswalks citywide in

denser, neighborhood-serving areas

Funding: \$200K for FY23

#### **Program Considerations:**

- Vision Zero High Injury Network emphasis
- Demographic and geographic equity
- Active transportation/transit focus

### **Proactive Program Criteria**


#### **Demographic**

- Block group density
- High Injury Network
- Pedestrian injury crash history
- Equity Priority Community
- Proximity to school

#### **Existing Physical Conditions**

- All-way STOP controlled
- Curb ramps
- Existing crosswalk striping
- Right-of-way width
- Muni stop
- Development pipeline

2022-2023 Program Draft Map



### **ENCAC Request Summary**

Of the 67 locations requested by the ENCAC:

- 4 locations have existing crosswalks.
- 10 locations will be addressed by the 2022-2023 proactive crosswalk program.
- 18 locations are not all-way STOP locations and will be evaluated by the SFMTA Operations Team.
- 16 locations will be coordinated with Public Works projects for installation.
- 19 locations will be considered in future years of the proactive crosswalk program.

### **Next Steps**

- Early 2023: Evaluation and site visits
- Spring 2023: Preparation of engineering drawings and work orders
- Summer 2023: Installation of the first 40+ locations of the proactive crosswalk program
- Summer 2023: Evaluation of the 18 ENCAC locations that are not all-way STOP controlled
