STRUCTURES OF MERIT

Section 1011 of Article 10 provides a mechanism to recognize a category of historical, architectural or aesthetic resources known as Structures of Merit. The purpose of this list is to recognize and encourage the protection, enhancement, perpetuation and use of resources that are not officially designated as landmarks and are not situated in designated historic districts. Article 10 does not regulate the review of alterations to Structures of Merit.

Over the past thirty years, the City has recognized nine Structures of Merit. The Planning Commission, acting on the advice of the Landmarks Preservation Advisory Board, is empowered to recognize, establish and maintain a list of Structures of Merit. The Landmarks Board as well as the Planning Commission shall adopt a resolution recognizing a Structure of Merit at the regular meetings of both bodies. Structures of Merit do not require Board of Supervisors approval. Project sponsors should utilize the Landmark and Historic District Designation Procedures forms for proposed Structures of Merit.
